

Mary lived her


Eucharistic faith even

At Mass, the altar is prepared to receive our offerings of bread and wine to become the body and blood of Jesus Christ.



Humility

In all humility, Mary offered her entire self to God. In all humility Our Savior offers his entire self to us.

The Visitation

"Sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvelous deeds." [Psalm 98] Mary was joyful, proclaiming the Lord's greatness with Elizabeth at the Visitation.



The Holy Spirit

At Mass, the priest asks God "the Father to send his Holy Spirit (or the power of his blessing) on the bread and wine, so that by his power they may become the body and blood of Jesus Christ and so that those who take part in the Eucharist may be one body and one spirit." [CCC 1353]




The Nativity

Imagine the **love** as Mary contemplated the face of her newborn Son.

Consider the **hope** and joy on the night of Jesus' birth. The shepherds came in **faith** to see their Savior and praised God.

In the first coming, the Christ Child freely offers Himself.

Today, Christ offers Himself in the Eucharist.



Presentation at the Temple

Simeon and Anna recognized their salvation in the Holy Child when Mary and Joseph presented baby Jesus at the Temple. There, they praised God. Do we share the great news by living our Eucharistic faith? Do we contemplate the Sacrifice Simeon foretold Mary?



Holy Communion

Jesus—God's **love** made manifest—came into this world to offer up his body, blood, soul, and divinity for our salvation. This sacrifice is re-presented to us in the Eucharistic celebration. We are then led into Communion with our Lord. Christ comes to us to become one with us.



Finding Jesus in the Temple

After three days of searching they found young Jesus in the Temple.

We find Jesus in the Eucharist. Emmanuel—God is with us.

Rejoice!








