# A Wonderful Connection to Holy Family

#### William Carrigan



In the summer of 1944, William Carrigan, a young real-estate developer who at the time was serving with the Red Cross in Italy, survived the Battle of Anzio and resolved to visit Padre Pio. The saint asked him if there was something he could give to the Church. Carrigan mentioned that he owned some beautiful property in rural Maryland, just outside of Washington, on a hilltop overlooking the city. He had thought before of how wonderful it would be if this property could be a place where people could come together to adore Christ in the Blessed Sacrament -- like that Biblical image of the shining city on a hill. Padre Pio told Carrigan that this was indeed what he should do. He then gave him a Miraculous Medal of Mary, and told him to bury it on the property, and to ask the Blessed Mother for her prayers -- and he told Carrigan that he would pray for this intention too.

After the war ended, Carrigan returned home and buried the miraculous medal he had received from Padre Pio on the hilltop property. And he prayed. In 1948, Archbishop O'Boyle visited the hilltop to survey the area. There Carrigan told the Archbishop of his dream. Archbishop O'Boyle was moved by his request, accepted the gift, and soon after designated the property for the building of a new parish church. In 1952, the Archbishop directed Fr. Joseph Gedra, our first pastor, to establish the parish of Holy Family.

In conjunction with this wonderful history, of which Padre Pio plays an essential part, Holy Family is delighted to accept the generous donation of the "I Embrace You" statue with its embedded 1st Class relic by the Pade Pio Foundation.

The relics will be available for public veneration at the Holy Family Catholic Church, located at 2210 Callaway St. Hillcrest Heights, MD 20748, on Tuesday, November 7<sup>th</sup>, from 9 a.m. to 6. P.m., with a Mass in honor of Padre Pio at 7:30 p.m.

The first and second-class relics of Saint Pio available for public veneration include:

- The crusts of his wounds
- Cotton gauze bearing his blood stains
- A lock of his hair
- His handkerchief soaked with his sweat only hours before he died
- A piece of Padre Pio's mantle



#### **Prayer of Padre Pio After Communion**

**Stay with me, Lord,** for it is necessary to have You present so that I do not forget You. You know how easily I abandon You.

**Stay with me, Lord,** because I am weak and I need Your strength, that I may not fall so often.

**Stay with me, Lord,** for You are my life, and without You, I am without fervor. Stay with me, Lord, for You are my light, and without You, I am in darkness. Stay with me, Lord, to show me Your will.

Stay with me, Lord, so that I hear Your voice and follow You.

**Stay with me, Lord,** for I desire to love You very much, and always be in Your company. **Stay with me, Lord,** if You wish me to be faithful to You.

**Stay with me, Lord,** for as poor as my soul is, I want it to be a place of consolation for You, a nest of love.

**Stay with me, Jesus,** for it is getting late and the day is coming to a close, and life passes; death, judgment, eternity approaches. It is necessary to renew my strength, so that I will not stop along the way and for that, I need You. It is getting late and death approaches, I fear the darkness, the temptations, the dryness, the cross, the sorrows. O how I need You, my Jesus, in this night of exile!

Stay with me tonight, Jesus, in life with all it's dangers. I need You.

**Let me recognize You** as Your disciples did at the breaking of the bread, so that the Eucharistic Communion be the Light which disperses the darkness, the force which sustains me, the unique joy of my heart.

**Stay with me, Lord,** because at the hour of my death, I want to remain united to You, if not by communion, at least by grace and love.

**Stay with me, Jesus,** I do not ask for divine consolation, because I do not merit it, but the gift of Your Presence, oh yes, I ask this of You!

**Stay with me, Lord,** for it is You alone I look for, Your Love, Your Grace, Your Will, Your Heart, Your Spirit because I love You and ask no other reward but to love You more & more. **With a firm love,** I will love You with all my heart while on earth and continue to love You perfectly during all eternity. **AMEN.**
