





Spirituality Chair Carol Monaco's reflections on the many ways CCW-ADW has helped us grow as women of faith and action, with a look toward our abundant future – with your participation. Her remarks were originally given at our June 25 Meet and Greet.



Snapshots from our Meet and Greet

The past work and continuing mission of the Council bring us together so that we can build on what we are called to do as children of God, now and in the years to come. Your help—your participation in the Council— can make that happen.

Each and every woman has talent, gifts from God that our Lord wants each of us to use in order to share God's love. Wherever we go, in whatever we do, like Mary our Blessed Mother, we can be conduits for the Holy Trinity—God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—to work in our lives, our parishes, our communities, our world.

For that purpose, the Council has three committees—Spirituality, Service, and Leadership. Like the National Council of Catholic Women's commissions, the purpose of our committees is to carry out our mission of spiritual growth and discipleship guided by Catholic social teaching, support service to the Church and our communities, as well as develop and strengthen our leadership skills.

For the sake of our mission, we have hosted several programs. For example, in 2018 we hosted Treasures of the Rosary in collaboration with the Archdiocese's Office of Family Life at the Franciscan Monastery. We learned that the mysteries of the Rosary teach us how to live a life of faith, hope, and love. By adhering to God's will, participating in Jesus' redemptive work, and following the promptings of the Holy Spirit, prayers and good works keep us connected to Heaven and to one another.

In addition, in 2018 we started hosting a nightly Rosary call. Any night of the week at 8 p.m. you can call in and pray the Rosary for the healing of Church, healing from the pandemic, and for callers' personal intentions. During the height of the pandemic, this nightly Rosary helped to maintain a sense of community at a time when we were all isolated. And it continues. During the pandemic, we also co-hosted with the Office of Family Life virtual workshop series for women— Finding Your Inner Balance and Dignity of the Woman. Both were meant to help deepen our faith and to recognize God's grace in our daily living as we face our daily challenges. By our faith in God's grace, we can become a source of spiritual strength for others.

In our recent collaboration with the Office of Family Life, we co-hosted a series on the Holy Eucharist based on Timothy O'Malley's book *Real Presence*. In that series, we learned that the past, present, and future come together in the Holy Eucharist. Jesus Christ sacrificed himself for our redemption. By giving us his Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Holy Eucharist, Christ is present within us for the sake of our salvation. In the Eucharist, we receive the total self-giving love of the Word made flesh. The love that we receive, we are called to give. Let us always remember to share that love.
